SOLDIER, POLICEMAN, POLISHER OF STONE: THE LIFE AND COLLECTION OF THEODORE SCHULTZ

In a quiet corner of the South Whitley, Indiana Public Library, one can find a lapidary treasure trove. Display cases along the wall hold trays full of a thousand polished stones. Their collector, Theodore Schultz, donated them to the library in 1990, contributing not only the stones, but funds for an addition to house them as well. Guests to the library today can view an award-winning collection that has traveled to eight different states and contains stones from every continent.

Theodore Schultz was born in Minnesota in 1897. He served in World War I in France and, upon his return to the States, moved to Washington, D.C. There he began a 20-year career as a White House police officer – a position later known as the Secret

Service. Through this job, Schultz met ambassadors from around the world. Some brought him bags of stones from their countries, like jade (which was not a stone that could be exported) and lapis lazuli.

Around 1951, Schultz began working with a diamond cutter, reselling his gems. One of his buyers at a company called Collins & Sherrer asked Schultz, given his intense interest in lapidary art and stones, if he'd heard of the local Washington Gem & Lapidary Society. He attended a club meeting with his wife, Mildred Ward – a South Whitley, Indiana native – and thus began a 30-year-long hobby of polishing stone. Three of the 2,000-plus cabochons Schultz handpolished even made their way to the Smithsonian: a Vistaite jasper from Oregon, a jasper from India, and a Domeykite from Michigan.



Presenters Jim Haves and Nick Smith recently walked attendees from our society through the extraordinary life and collection of Theodore Schultz. Some of the trays were passed

around, including Australian Opals and Chrysoprase, Japanese jade, Siberian charoite, Congolese malachite, and corundum in zoisite from North Carolina. A Helenite gem, forged from the ash of the Mt. St. Helen's eruption, was also circulated.


There are also other things to see and do in the Springfield area if you have any extra time to spend there. This should be a very nice time, weather-wise, to visit the area.

UNEXPECTED ASBESTOS MINERAL FOUND IN WISCONSIN PARK

A "something different" from the beach at Alford Park, north side of Kenosha – something I wasn't expecting. This vein, if you look closely, is parallel fibers, somewhat shiny. It is an asbestos mineral, probably chrysotile. Don't panic, it won't kill you, just don't grind it and snort it regularly, okay?

This is how chrysotile is found, developing in cracks in rocks. Being a fibrous rock, it can be woven into gloves and clothing that won't burn, along with many other uses.

There are websites that let you know wave heights forecast for Lake Michigan each time the waves get big. Afterwards, there is new inventory to consider. Still, in six years of rockhounding after a day of strong east wind from over the lake, I don't remember finding a vein of chrysotile before.

There is/was a giant asbestos mine west of Toronto in Canada (Google "Jeffrey Mine"), so it is certainly possible, through past geologic events, that some made it into the Great Lakes. It is not rare stuff. Magnesium is common in the Earth (think electrolytes in your Gatorade, and it's in the green plants, in chlorophyll) and when it's with oxygen, silicon and water in the right circumstances, chrysotile forms.



Don't worry, it hasn't hurt the lake. Humanmade pollutants are far worse. (But that is a "thread" for another place.)

"Always something new" is a sales slogan of a prominent mineral dealer. It is also the experience of a rockhound on the Lake Michigan beach, and really, anyone appreciating the natural world.
