A NIGHT AT THE MUSEUM — AND AT THE BUCKWHEAT MINE DUMP

A row of vendor tents and tables lined one side of Evans Street in Franklin, NJ on April 23, 2022. The trailhead of this roadside mineral market was the Franklin Mineral Museum, a "science museum with exhibits spotlighting the geology and history of the area's zinc mines" (franklinmineralmuseum.com), where I was about to attend a night dig at the Buckwheat Mine dump.

The museum's attractions include the Local Mining Heritage Room, housing over 4,000 minerals from the Franklin and Sterling mining districts, the American Indian Room, which features stone tools made by the Lenni Lenape Indians, the Fossil Room with its mastodon tusk, the Welsh Hall collection of over 5,000 minerals found worldwide, and the Mine Replica's mining artifacts and models of mining practices.

Seeing the Fluorescent Room was included in the price (\$12.00) of participating in the night dig. After paying the admission fee at the museum's front desk, diggers were led to a dark room at the back left corner of the museum. In it, glowing red, green, orange, yellow, and blue, is one 32-foot case of local fluorescent minerals across from a row of smaller displays showcasing the less common fluorescent minerals from the area.

After this exciting review of what has been found in the area, diggers were led down a dirt ramp to the "world famous" Buckwheat dump, 60 feet below the museum's level, to try their luck at locating their own fluorescent finds. We began searching a bit early, so it was hard at first to locate the glowing minerals, but as it became darker, I both found more minerals and noticed the blinking light at the corner of the museum – a guide for finished diggers to follow back up.

At the top of the ramp is a shed with a list of the minerals found in the Buckwheat dump and the colors they fluoresce. Boxes with one open side facing the digger have UV lamps fixed to their tops so the selected specimens can be inspected. Any undesired finds can be left in a wheelbarrow outside the shed; the keepers are trekked back into the museum, where the digger pays for them by the pound (\$4.00).

Should you wish to try your luck at the museum's Buckwheat Mine Dump, night digs are hosted multiple times throughout the year. Get GLOWING!

The Ozark Mountain Gem and Mineral Society is looking forward to this year's show and Midwest Federation Convention October 22nd and 23rd. The convention will be held at the at the Springfield Expo Center in downtown Springfield, Missouri. Springfield has a lot of local and close opportunities for other activities. Johnny Morris' Wonders of Wildlife Museum and Aquarium is a great attraction. There are several other attractions listed in your convention packet. Branson is only 45 minutes away, with a variety of shows, amusement parks, lake attractions, and golf courses.

The weather should be nice fall temperatures, with warm days and windbreaker nights, so this is an extremely comfortable time of year to come. The show and many attractions available are family oriented.

The show will have a vast range of vendors and material to ponder, along with a Kid's Corner for the young ones to explore rock interests – plenty of eye candy for everyone. Federation guests will receive a one-day complimentary pass for Saturday; a two-day pass will be available for \$5. There will also be several presentations to sit in on and enjoy. We'll have presentations on fossils, what the Federation can do for its members, basic tumbling, how the Springfield area was formed, identifying coral fossils, and possibly more. And don't just stop at the show! The Federation Banquet is Saturday night at Big Whiskey's American Restaurant, just down the street from the Expo Center.

We have two field trips planned – one for local fossils and one to Fantastic Caverns. There is a possibility of hunting fossils on private un-hunted land but it has not been confirmed yet. We have to check it out if the weather will permit. Otherwise, we will hunt fossils elsewhere. This trip will be on Friday to allow more participation without pulling people from the Federation meetings on Saturday.

On Sunday, we have a trip to Fantastic Caverns planned. This is a fully guided ride-through tour of caverns filled with geological features. Plan on attending this fun trip that lasts about 55 minutes with a stop at a gift shop for neat treasures. If we have 20 or more in a group at one time, there is a great discount! And it's only about 20 minutes from the Expo Center.


There are also other things to see and do in the Springfield area if you have any extra time to spend there. This should be a very nice time, weather-wise, to visit the area.
